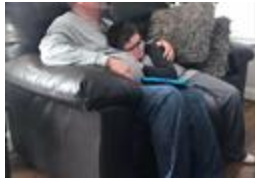

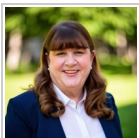
“ *My heart is breaking! So fortunate to have grown up with Bryan. We are about 6 months apart. He is more like a sibling than a cousin.*

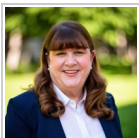

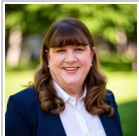
